Report from the Acting Chief of Police- (Since October, 2014)


- FTO completed for Officer Scherer
- FTO in progress for Officer Sweet
- Met with Undersheriff Robert Quick (Lander County) concerning animal control center.
Further on this matter later in report.
- Training still in progress for all officers.
 - Acting Chief Developed ETHICS slide show, implemented the training, and introduced the BIA Code of Ethics, developed ETHICS questionnaire to enhance training and identify areas of concern which was completed by all officers.
 - All officers agreed to and signed BIA law enforcement code of conduct with the understanding of required "OATH."
 - Acting Chief implemented training concerning department moral.
 - Acting Chief created a patrol officer book containing necessary documents to enhance efficiency and competence in duties. Several hours were put into the creation and organization of the books. Officers Cox, Sherer, DuBois, Ramirez, and Salazar contributed time and effort in material and construction of the books.
 - Acting Chief conducted training in report writing and procedures for all officers.
 - See statistic reports for further.
 - Acting Chief identified training need in area of radio control and traffic will see further on this later in report.)

- (September) Met with Denise Te-Moak Housing Authority.
 - Denise identified a communication issue between law enforcement and housing. In light of this, Acting Chief recreated a document which was initially utilized for closing the gap of communication between victims of domestic violence and advocacy. (See housing form for further.) – Discussion
- (September) Met with Te-Moak Social Services Cheserea.
 - Cheserea identified a communication issue between law enforcement and housing. In light of this, Acting Chief recreated a document which was initially utilized for closing the gap of communication between victims of domestic violence and advocacy. (See housing form for further.) – Discussion
 - These forms have been instrumental in bridging the gap of communication and enhancing “Community Orientated Policing.”
- Made contact with Elko County Dispatch Center’s Manager Dona in order to familiarize officers with dispatching procedures which will enhance the efficiency and productivity of our officers protection and service to the community.
- (September) Acting Chief initiated community oriented policing practices and strategies training with all officers.
 - Department participated in Halloween events held Wells, Elko, and Battle Mountain bands.
 - Officers’ implementation of community orientated policing tactics have generated positive results.

- Officers are ensuring positive contact with community members which has no doubt attributed to the abundance of increased contact from community members concerning their observations of possible illegal activity. – Discussion
- Acting Corporal actively addressing areas of equipment
 - Ensured completion of patrol camera equipment repair. The computer towers have not been functioning and were needing to be repaired. The process is now completed and officers were able to download the tapes freeing up the space on the drive to enable further recordings. Most of the patrol units recording equipment are now operational.
 - Addressed officer proper equipment needs.
 - Addressed vehicle maintenance needs. Battle mountain assigned patrol units were in desperate need of repairs which to date have been completed.
 - Created and implemented use of patrol vehicle inspection sheets to be completed by each officer prior to every shift. This practice will aid in the proper maintenance and care of the vehicles. There are many benefits of this implementation. One example is the enhanced longevity of the patrol units and cut in cost from improper care and maintenance of patrol units.
 - Located several uniforms in equipment area. He had them cleaned and prepared for use which also aids in the prevention of unnecessary cost.
- Staff and Officers participated in Nevada Parade

- Acting Chief obtained an example of MOU currently being utilized by another tribal police department. Acting Chief modified the MOU to address the current needs of the battle mountain band in reference to services of the Western Shoshone Department of Public Safety to include a dog control concern. The MOU has been provided to the WSDPS board for review and identification of further modifications.
- Lander County has signed and approved agreement for dispatching services and are awaiting final draft of MOU.
- Acting Chief brought Ordinance No. 05-ORD-TM-03 (Te-Moak Traffic Non-Indian Civil Fine Ordinance) to the attention of Tribal Prosecutor for discussion and review for any needed modification and implementation. We will be seeing further on this topic in the near future.

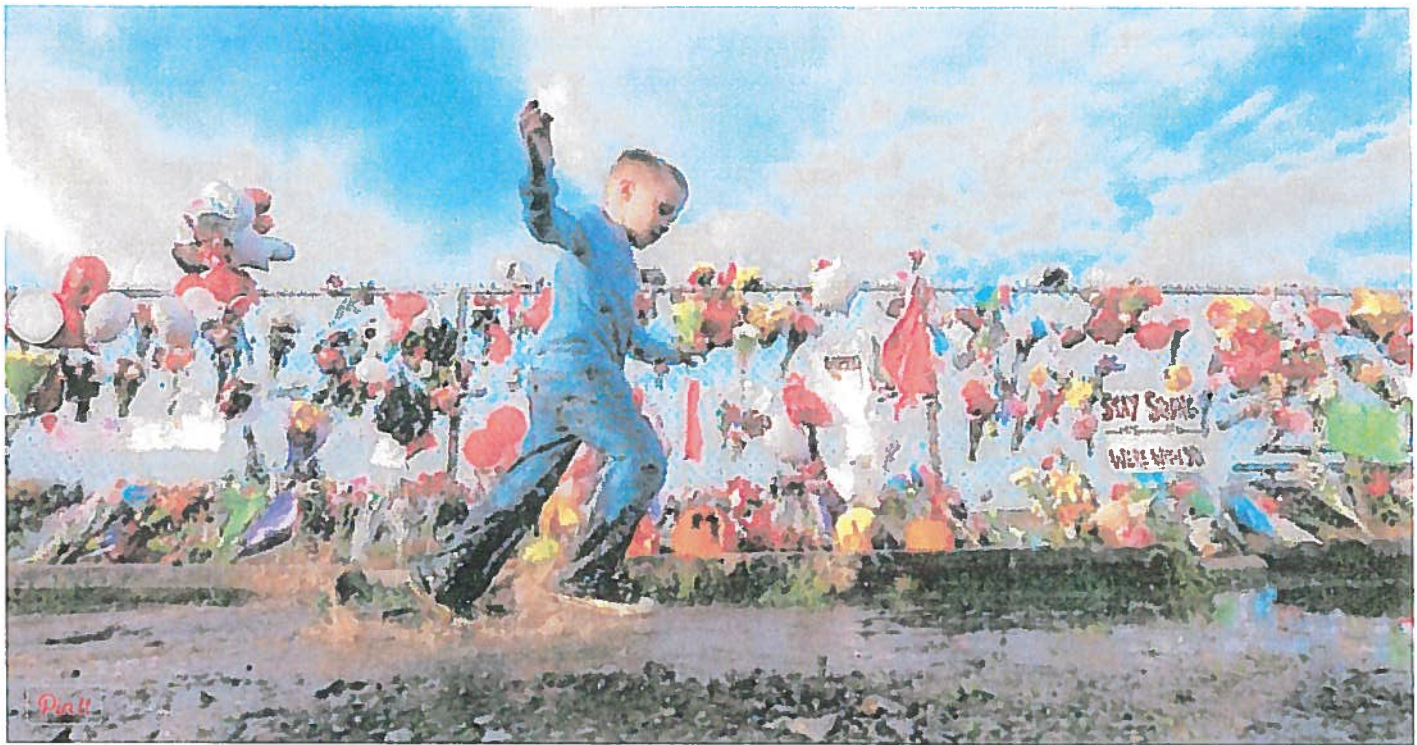


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Tribal service for Washington school shooter

TULALIP, Wash. — A memorial service for the 15-year-old gunman in a deadly Washington state school shooting is being held on the Tulalip Indian reservation.

Jaylen Fryberg, a homecoming prince who was from a prominent tribal family, was remembered Thursday during a crowded ceremony at a recreation center on the reservation north of Seattle.

Tribal police wore arm bands that read "In loving memory of Jaylen Fryberg."

Two 14-year-old girls were killed when Fryberg opened fire Friday at Marysville-Pilchuck High School. Two other wounded students remain in critical condition, and a third is in satisfactory condition.

Meanwhile, officials say the investigation into the shooting will be lengthy to ensure any information released is accurate.

Snohomish County Prosecutor Mark Roe met with detectives Tuesday and said they need to be given time for a careful investigation.
