

but was not required to perform her talent. She learned the song during the Shoshone Community Language Initiative over the summer, at Great Basin College. "SCLI affected me in a positive way, every weekend we went to new historical Shoshone sites. It was interesting to learn about the history we didn't read in text books." She plans to attend the summer program again, next year.

Esaw began her dancing career at a young age. She tried fancy shawl for a short time, then returned to competing in the jingle dress category.

She was also chosen, by the committee, to be the Head Lady dancer during the Saturday night session, where she and the Head Man dancer, Tristin Ike, were required to lead the dancers onto the floor during intertribals, and Grand Entry. They also danced to an honor song, where they displayed their skills, which showed why they were chosen for their duties.

When royalty is selected, they are often expected to travel to different pow-wows and represent their tribes. Esaw is planning to attend the Ne-

vada Day Pow-Wow, in Carson City, and the Veteran's Day Pow-Wow, in Carson City.

"I'm looking forward to traveling to new pow-wows and meeting new people along the way," said Esaw.

When asked what having this title means to her, Esaw replied, "It means being more of a leader, to the younger girls and boys, representing my tribe and being proud of who I am as a Native American."

She plans to continue learning about her culture and Shoshone language. She also plans to become more involved in her com-

munity, and with elders and the younger generation.

Esaw continued, "I just want to keep the culture going, and keep it strong, practice the culture more, and make it known, that we are still here."

Esaw is the daughter of Lillian Kelly Collins and Barry Esaw, both of Elko. Her maternal grandparents are Arloa Kelly of Owyhee, and the late Gladden Kelly, also of Owyhee. Her paternal grandmother is Ruby Esaw.

Note: Brianna's sister, Da'Shalyne Esaw, held the title of Miss Sho-Pai Queen 2014-2015.

# Mentorship

Being provided a mentor is not only a requirement of Nevada Promise Scholarship, but it is a key part of success. No later than December 31, 2017, GBC will assign mentors to assist students with Nevada Promise scholarship requirements, as well as the GBC admissions and financial aid processes.

# **Community Service**

Nevada Promise requires students to complete 20 hours of community service, no later than April 30, 2018. A list of community service partners and a service tracking form will be available soon.

- High school diploma from a public high school in a county of another state that borders Nevada and accepts Nevada residents; or
- General Equivalency Diploma (GED) or equivalent document.

- Complete at least 20 hours of eligible community service; and

— Enroll in a minimum of 12 semester credit hours in an associate degree program, a bachelor's degree program or a certificate of achievement program for each semester of the school year immediately following the school year in which the student graduates from high school.

# Award Amount

As a last-dollar scholarship,

the Nevada Promise Scholarship covers the cost of the registration fee and mandatory fees (tuition is not charged to residents of Nevada) not covered by other gift aid.

Gift aid is defined as a federal Pell Grant, a federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), a Silver State Opportunity Grant (SSOG), or a Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship (GGMS).

The Nevada Promise Scholarship can provide for up to three years of coverage of registration fees and other mandatory fees to eligible students not covered by other gift aid, subject to appropriation.

If there are not sufficient funds available for all eligible scholarship applicants, students will be awarded in order of the date the application was received.
